

Lethbridge College Aptitude Test

Career planning is the lifelong process of thinking about values, needs and preferences and then using that information to explore work, life and learning options. A **Lethbridge College** Career and Academic Advisor can help students plan during this process.

Their Career and Academic Advisors will with students over multiple sessions based on their needs. During the first session, the advisor will go over the assessment process and get the student to complete the Strong Interest Inventory (SII) online. A follow-up meeting will be scheduled a week later during which the advisor will go through the assessment results and explore thoughts and ideas for career paths. Course details:
