Grade 12 Checklist

May

- ◇ Most offers of admission are made in May. Hopefully you should hear back soon from a post-secondary school!
- ◇ When you hear back from a post-secondary school, remember to put your Student ID Number and PAC (Personal Access Code) in the special folder you created. You will use these quite often in the future.
- ◇ As soon as you have decided which offer to accept, notify the post-secondary school of your decision.
- ◇ If you are placed on a post-secondary school's waiting list and intend to enroll if accepted, call or write the Admissions Office to ask how to strengthen your application or to find out your standing.
- ◇ If you're considering student funding, ask your high school guidance counsellor for a student loan application form and begin filling it out. If you prefer, you can also apply online.
TIP: It's a good idea to submit a student loan application by May 31.

- 1 Submit your application early:

- 3 Don't worry if you feel your application is not overly strong in one area or another. Remember that a perfect application is unlikely and it may as well be your imperfect application that is selected.

THE AWARD

Applications are submitted to principals who then forward them to Horizon School Division's office or directly to Robbie Charlebois by the last working day of May. A student is selected to receive the \$1000 award and is contacted using the information provided in this application. Students then call in to make arrangements for their check to be issued during their first semester of post-secondary.

The Elmer and Ona Hansen Memorial Scholarship

4-H Alberta inspires, educates, and develops outstanding rural and urban youth, future leaders, and engaged citizens. Supporting ambitious youth who pursue higher education through scholarships is a big part of 4-H Alberta's commitment to youth. We are recognized as the most impactful youth leadership organization in Alberta.

The Elmer and Ona Hansen Memorial Scholarship is open to all Alberta rural youth and is designed to help rural farm youth who must leave home to pursue a post-secondary education or trade. The following scholarship amounts will be awarded in 2021:

- One scholarship: \$20,000
- One scholarship: \$15,000
- One scholarship: \$10,000
- Seven (7) scholarships at \$5,000 each

Student Eligibility/How to apply:

- Applicant must be enrolled as a first-year student at an acknowledged post-secondary institution and not have previously started or completed a post-secondary program.
- Must be a rural farm young person, resident of Alberta, and complete the information as outlined in the application. Applicant must provide confirmation that applicant has or currently is living on a family farm as well as provide the farm's legal land description.
- Applicant must have graduated from high school, have received their high school diploma, and be no older than 25 years of age. Please attach a copy of your high school transcript to your application form.
- Applicant must need to leave home to pursue a post-secondary education or trade. Please provide proof that you are not living at home, i.e. through a rental or dorm receipt.
- You must submit a photo with your application. Photo must be suitable for publication – a grad picture is ideal. Photocopies or proofs are not suitable. Quality scanned photos are acceptable.
- **4-H experience is not mandatory to qualify for this award.**

The application for the Elmer and Ona Hansen Memorial Scholarship is open May 1, 2021 until June 30, 2021 at Noon with the application available on the [4-H Alberta website](https://www.4hab.com/scholarships/).
