Graduation Update

This year's W. R. Myers Ceremony will consist of a Cap and Gown Graduation ceremony on May 23, 2025 followed by a Grade 12 Banquet on Saturday, May 24th.

Graduation Requirements

Only students who are on track for achieving a High School Diploma, a High School Certificate of Achievement, or a High School Certificate of Completion will be allowed to participate in the Cap and Gown Ceremony. Graduation Credit checks for at-risk students must be completed prior to April 10th to verify eligibility to participate in the Cap and Gown ceremony.

In addition to students who are on-track for graduation, Grade 12 W.R. Myers students who are registered in and passing a minimum of 10 credits each semester are welcome to participate in the Grade 12 Banquet.

Cap and Gown Photos:

LifeTouch will be doing our Cap and Gown photos between February 10-13th at W.R. MYERS in the Library.

All graduates must get their photo taken for our yearbook and composite picture. In order to book your sitting, go to prestigeportraits.ca. If you need assistance booking your appointment, contact the office. It is suggested that males bring a dress shirt and tie for formal photos and females wear vneck or scoop neck top for formal photos. Unfortunately, the photographers will not have shirts and ties for graduates to use.

Banquet Tickets

Banquet tickets will go on sale on March 13th. Students can purchase tickets for themselves, their parents, step-parents, and a guest. This is 4-6 tickets per grad. Students can also request to put on waitlist for additional tickets at time of purchase.

One of our grade 12 students, Kevin Kroeker, will be spending three months at the Polytechnic furthering his welding skills in the Pre-Employment Welding program. Tyson Fettig, also a grade 12 student at W.R. Myers, completed this same program just prior to Christmas. Congratulations to our dual credit students from this past semester, as they earned some excellent results. The Polytechnic will finalise courses for the 2025-26 school year in April. Students can watch for classroom presentations at that time, and decide if there is a course that suits their needs. We have more applicants than spaces to fill, so be sure to set yourself up for success by maintaining strong academic results, steady attendance, and positive classroom interactions.

Work, Learn, and Earn Credits over summer with Horizon School Division.

Summer School course dates: July 2 - 25, 2025



Horizon School Division summer school was established with the aim of meeting student and family needs, and to provide opportunities for students to get a step ahead, or to maintain timely progress, on their high school studies.

Horizon School Division summer programming* consists of courses for students entering grade 10, as well as Work Experience and Registered Apprentice Program credit opportunities, primarily for students entering grades 11 and 12.

*Students can accumulate a total of 10 credits per summer, as per Alberta Education guidelines.

Summer School - for students entering grade 10

Career & Life Management - CALM (3 credits) (You can bundle this with PE10) Career and Life Management (CALM): CALM in senior high school equips students to make informed decisions across various life domains, fostering well-being and respect for others. It is a compulsory health literacy course in Alberta and essential for meeting graduation requirements. HCS3000 is offered with CALM as an additional credit opportunity.

HCS3000 - Workplace Safety Systems (1 credit) - INCLUDED with CALM

HCS3000 is a workplace safety course. It is required for students seeking high school credit in Work Experience, Dual-Credit Trades, or Registered Apprentice Programming. This course is offered via SafeGen and must be completed online. HCS3000 is a prerequisite for HCS3010. This course will be applied to all students registering for CALM.

Phys Ed 10 (3 or 5 credits)

Approximately 10 types of activities must be completed, and a participant log must be recorded. Students need to complete 50 hours of activity for a 3-credit course, and 80 hours of activity for a 5-credit course. This course will have a Pass/Fail grading format, as opposed to a percentage grade.

HCS 3010 - Workplace Safety Practices (1 credit)

Students wishing to eventually enroll in Registered Apprenticeship Programming and/or apply for Dual Credit Trades in high school should register for this single-credit course. Workplace Safety Practices is an extension of Workplace Safety Systems, allowing students to explore safety principles and view and apply these concepts in various contexts.

AGR 3000 - Agriculture Safety (1 credit)

AGR3000 is a work safety course emphasizing agriculture safety and awareness. This course is required for students wishing to participate in the GREEN program. AGR3000 is offered online only via SafeGen. On behalf of the Palix Foundation, Taber Community Action & Prevention Society, Horizon School Division, and Taber Police Service, you're invited to the


