This year's W. R. Myers Ceremony will consist of a Cap and Gown Graduation ceremony on Friday, May 23rd followed by a Grade 12 Banquet on Saturday, May 24th.

Graduation Requirements

Only students who are on track for achieving a High School Diploma, a High School Certificate of Achievement, or a High School Certificate of Completion will be allowed to participate in the Cap and Gown Ceremony. Graduation Credit checks for at-risk students must be completed prior to April 10th to verify eligibility to participate in the Cap and Gown ceremony.

In addition to students who are on-track for graduation, Grade 12 W.R. Myers students who are registered in and passing a minimum of 10 credits each semester are welcome to participate in the Grade 12 Banquet.

Banquet Tickets

Banquet tickets are on sale now. Students can purchase tickets for themselves, their parents, step-parents, and a guest. This is 4-6 tickets per grad. Students can also request to put on waitlist for additional tickets at time of purchase. Unsold tickets will be offered to students on the waitlist starting April 7th. The last day to purchase banquet tickets is April 29th.

Table Selection

Table selection starts on May 1st. Table selection will be guided by staff in order to provide optimal seating for all. Please note that all school fees and grad fees must be paid prior to table selection.

Measles

There is more measles around the world. So far this year, Canada has seen more measles cases, including in Ontario, Quebec, British Columbia, Manitoba, and Alberta.

At this time, there are no measles at your school, but it is important for parents to know about the dangers and get help from Alberta Health Services (AHS) Public Health.

What is Measles?

Measles is a sickness that is very easy to spread. It spreads through the air that we breathe. Some people can become very sick from measles, and sometimes, they can die.

Signs of measles can be:

- Fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red eyes
- A rash that starts on the face and spreads to the rest of the body

Signs can start 8 to 12 days after being around measles, but sometimes it can take up to 21 days.

Measles can cause other problems like ear infections, lung infections (pneumonia), and seizures. It can be worse for young children, pregnant women, and people with weak immune systems. If you or your child have any signs of measles, stay home. If you have a rash, stay home for four full days after the rash has started. Stay away from other people so you don't get them sick. Call Health Link at 811 before going to a doctor or hospital.

How to Stay Safe From Measles

The best way to keep yourself and your family safe is by getting two needles of the vaccine or medicine. The vaccine works very well and is safe.

- If you were born in or after 1970, you need two needles of the measles vaccine to be safe.
- In Alberta the vaccine is free.

To check if your child has had the two needles of the vaccine, call Health Link at 811 or call your local health center. If you are 14 years or older, you can check your immunization record online at My Health Record. For more information, visit ahs.ca/immunize or talk to your doctor or healthcare provider.

Measles Case Response:

If measles comes to your school, Public Health will work with the school to keep everyone safe and lower the chance of measles spreading. To stop the spread of measles, Public Health rules say that anyone with measles and those who are not vaccinated must stay at home and away from others until it's safe. We also ask you to keep children home if they are feeling sick. Getting two needles of the measles vaccine before any measles cases are at school will protect your child and keep them from being sent home.


What You Should Do:
